



### **Bruce Lewenstein**

Professor, Department of Communication, Cornell University

For good reasons, many science communication researchers have turned their attention to the COVID-19 pandemic. We want to know how to help people understand the science of the pandemic, as well as the best practices for protecting both personal and public health. But the pandemic has also shown how complicated science communication is: politics, emotions, cultural traditions, available resources, uncertain research findings, access to information, unintended misinformation, active disinformation, and a range of other issues turn out to be at least as important as simply providing good, clear explanations of well-established science. But is any of this new? Has COVID-19 actually changed science communication research? This talk will explore these issues.

The main purpose of this panel discussion kicking off on the second day of the IAMCR 2022 Suzhou Pre-conference on SC (8:30-9:30 pm, July 8 Beijing time) is to address research opportunities and practical challenges arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, which has dramatically impacted science communication practically and theoretically.

The panel will be moderated by Hepeng Jia, a professor of science communication at Soochow University. It will discuss some key questions below: Whether the current SC scholarship has been effective and broad enough to guide us to design, deliver and evaluate communication campaigns to address the public health crisis. Science/Health/Risk communication studies have well identified and stressed the important roles of trust, experts' credibility, personal relevance, and media use, but many practitioners may intuitively utilize them without thinking their academic origins. Then, what exactly SC scholars' contribution to the practices are? Most science and health theories are based on individual actions/persuasions. How can theories guide practice in non-Western settings where individualism often gives in to collectivistic values?

The COVID-19 has given China an unprecedented opportunity to rethink both academic research and practical applications of science communication. Most of the previous studies on science communication and health communication are based on the Western context and lack attention to the China's special socio-cultural contexts. Prof. Hepeng Jia, Prof. Guoyang Wang and their colleagues in Soochow University have found a series of science communication and health communication phenomena with Chinese socio-cultural characteristics. For instance, the nationalism of the Chinese public is significantly related to their behavior and willingness of epidemic prevention and vaccination, and nationalism is also the important frame for the Chinese public to interpret and disseminate information related to the COVID-19. This series of studies effectively broadened the regional attributes of science communication and health communication and health communication, especially facing the COVID-19, thus providing some vivid cases for the development of science communication and health communication with Oriental socio-cultural characteristics.

## Plenary report 2: Digital Media and Participatory Cultures of Health and Illness

Among many other things, the Covid-19 crisis has accentuated the mundanity of our digital media use: as physical objects (i.e., smartphones) and intangible spaces (i.e., social media), digital media are increasingly ubiquitous and part of the norm. Against this background, evolving forms of participation are emerging and thriving, with "participatory cultures" increasingly intertwining with "digital cultures". Research has drawn attention to the way the sociotechnical infrastructures of social media can destabilise traditional power roles in processes of meaning making, for instance, facilitating the emergence of "hashtags publics" and "networked counterpublics" that increasingly contribute to shaping the public understanding of societal issues. But how does this resonate to the domain of health and illness? By drawing on my work on Twitter use to discuss hereditary cancer conditions, in my talk I will focus on the longitudinal evolution of curation, framing, storytelling, and, ultimately, epistemic practices in social media health issue publics. I will advance six propositions on the impact of social media use on the making of participatory practices around health and illness. These propositions might work as a starting point to reflect on how social media publics can shape the public understanding of health crises.

## Plenary report 3: Metaverse and the Future of Science Communication

New Media Research Center of Tsinghua University School of Journalism and Communication recently released the "Metaverse Development Research Report Version 2.0." The report compares the development of metaverse from following seven aspects: origin of metaverse, concept and attributes, technology and industry chain, scenario application, risk point and governance, hot issues, and far future outlook.

According to the report, the metaverse industry is currently in a subhealthy state, withcompanies flocking to the metaverse field and packaging themselves as metaverse companies, both the industry and the market need to return to rationality. From the perspective of industrial development reality, the meta-universe industry is still far from the full industrial coverage and ecological completion, and is still in the foundation stage of theoretical construction and in the exploration stage of social plus game scene application. In addition, at the level of technical risk, metaverse needs to break the technical shortcomings, and technical breakthrough is a problem that metaverse needs to solve. Only after a major technological breakthrough is achieved can the setting and application of the metaverse model be further explored. Therefore, promoting basic digital technology research is an important development strategy for the metaverse at this stage.

## Plenary report 4: Reconsidering the Role of Science Education in a Public Health Crisis

One of the rationales for science literacy is supporting the public in making informed science-related decisions throughout life. However, empirical studies have demonstrated a complex relationship between science knowledge and decision making, suggesting that decisions contrasting with the scientific consensus are not necessarily the result of ignorance in the sciences. Such decisions may be the outcome of 'motivated reasoning', where decision-making is influenced by individuals' beliefs, commitments, motivations, and past experiences alongside one's knowledge.

Here we use real-life science-related dilemmas caused by the COVID-19 outbreak to shed light on the interaction of science literacy and motivated reasoning in science-related decision-making. Findings indicated that the potential for motivated reasoning played a vital role in decision-making. When the respondents had the potential for motivated reasoning, they were less likely to adhere to social distancing guidelines and recommendations that contradicted their interests. The relatively marginal role science literacy played compared with motivated reasoning in everyday personal dilemmas is troubling. It undermines the assumption that science literacy is applicable and useful when people make daily decisions, particularly when dealing with complex scientific issues that affect personal considerations.
